

Cllr S Trevelyan – July 2025 Report

I am writing to provide the latest report as requested. Please find attached the document, which offers a comprehensive overview of our recent activities and progress. Should you have any questions or require further clarification, please do not hesitate to reach out.

Notably, I am pleased to report that the Bugle Youth Club has found a new location at Treverbryn Hall. This move is long overdue and should greatly benefit the youth of the surrounding villages. Additionally, a fully certified and insured football coach from Treverbryn has approached me with the intention of coaching kids during the holidays. I will be speaking with them this week to confirm their arrangements.

There have been numerous emails and messages regarding anti-social behaviour in Bugle. The issue involves a few families whose actions are significantly impacting the community. The situation is exacerbated by the perceived inaction of the police, which is causing frustration among residents. We are aware of the individuals involved, including those dealing drugs, who continue their activities despite obvious signs of affluence while on benefits. I plan to write to the commissioner for answers and, if necessary, bring this matter to the media along with affected residents. Addressing this issue is crucial before we can consider plans for community improvements such as a community garden or better playground facilities.

I would also like to bring attention to the subject of Mollinis Park. It seems that discussions regarding the park are being intentionally vague, perhaps in the hope that I will forget. I assure you, I will not. The sooner the park is made available to the community, the better.

Devolution has been a prominent topic this week, and I was one of the few in my group to vote in favour of it, at least in principle. However, I firmly believe that the people of Cornwall should have a say in this decision once the pros, cons, and costs have been made public. This issue should not be leveraged by the Lib Dem coalition to gain public support when devolution might significantly impact the county. As a proud Cornishman, I am open to the idea if everything aligns, even though the decision will ultimately be made by others.

Community chest funds are now available, however they have been dramatically reduced from £3000 to £1400, so the ppl I have promised funds will still get them albeit at a lesser amount
