

## **CLlr Jamie Hanlon – Monthly Report to Treverbyn Parish Council**

Reporting Period: October 2025

Division: Penwithick and Boscoppa

### **1. Community Engagement and Casework**

- Treverbyn Churchyard Safety: Responded to concerns raised by Revd Canon K Paul Arthur regarding overhanging trees near the school. A site visit was conducted by the Environment Steward, and a team has been scheduled to cut back the bushes.
- Trenarren View Parking Issues: Liaised with Cornwall Council regarding a persistent obstruction caused by a white van. Advised residents to contact the police due to limitations in enforcement powers.
- A391 Shared Use Path Maintenance: Raised issues of overgrown vegetation and reduced accessibility. Cornwall Highways confirmed clearance works are scheduled for November under the annual maintenance closure.

### **2. Infrastructure and Planning**

- Carluddon Technology Park Consultation: Provided feedback on the proposed disposal of Council-owned land at Carluddon Technology Park Phase 2. Attended the AMG meeting to discuss local implications.
- Planning Updates: Reviewed weekly planning lists and enforcement reports for October. Noted appeal decision PA23/02629 for a solar farm near Carland Cross was allowed with no costs claimed.

### **3. Council Responsibilities and Representation**

- Remembrance Wreaths: Coordinated with Cornwall Council and Democratic Services to confirm wreath arrangements. Wreath inserts will be available at New County Hall reception on 28th October.
- Health & Adult Social Care Committee: Participated in discussions on NHS dental access, ambulance service changes, and winter pressures planning. Advocated for community-first responder models and better rural coverage.
- Planning Training: Attended modular training on renewable energy and planning appeals. Raised questions on community benefits and decommissioning practices for solar and wind developments.

### **4. Environmental Improvements**

- Treverbyn Estate Walkaround: Conducted a site visit with Cormac to address long-standing issues including overgrown hedges, lack of drop kerbs, and inconsistent grass cutting. Requested coordinated intervention and signage for dog fouling.
