1. Community Engagement and Casework

Responded to concerns about overgrown vegetation along the A391 shared use path. Submitted photographic evidence via Casework Assist.

Visited a resident in Stenalees to follow up on rat infestation and dead trees with TPOs. Issues remain under review.

2. Council and Committee Participation

Attended Miscellaneous Licensing Committee on 12 September.

Participated in Central Sub Area Planning Committee briefing and meeting regarding PA24/02955 Hendra Court.

Spoke at Cabinet meeting on 16 September, supporting automatic enrolment for free school meals.

Raised accessibility concerns at HASCOSC Informal Briefing, including analogue-to-digital transition and closed captioning.

3. Policy and Strategic Development

Engaged with officers on accessibility in the Cornwall Local Plan. Invited to contribute to informal Member working group.

Attended briefing on Cornwall Development and Decision Wheel. Supported transparency and member access to data.

4. Local Events and Representation

Participated in National Rural Conference 2025 with the Rural Services Network.

Scheduled to attend Sky Primary School opening on 30 September.
