Parish Engagement and Casework

I have continued to respond to parish-related enquiries raised by residents and by Treverbyn Parish Council, including correspondence with the Parish Administrator and Clerk on local issues affecting Treverbyn Road and surrounding areas.

I supported residents regarding a blocked public right of way and associated flooding issues on the Clay Trails near Trethurgy. Cornwall Council's Countryside Service has confirmed that remedial works will be undertaken by the landowner, as the land is not in Cornwall Council ownership.

I have continued to assist residents with planning-related concerns, including correspondence regarding planning permissions PA26/00978 and PA26/00979. Where appropriate, I have advised that formal responses must be progressed through Cornwall Council's casework system.

Planning and Development

I reviewed the weekly planning lists issued by Cornwall Council and monitored applications affecting the Treverbyn area.

In relation to Mulberry Gardens (PA24/05849), I noted comments circulated under the Five Day Protocol and considered the professional advice provided regarding planning grounds. I have a Microsoft Teams meeting scheduled with Planning Officers week commencing 30th March to discuss how this matter should be progressed to the Central Sub-Area Planning Committee in May.

Highways and Transport

I have been working with Cornwall Council officers on a Community Highways Improvement Programme (CHIP) Expression of Interest relating to parking issues outside Carclaze Methodist Church on Treverbyn Road. Supporting information and mapping have been provided by the Community Link Officer to assist with the submission.

Funding, Community Projects and Partnerships

I continue to engage with Community Area Partnership processes and officers where parish-related funding opportunities or community projects arise.

General

I continue to engage constructively with the Parish Clerk and Cornwall Council officers via written correspondence and telephone on parish matters as they arise, and I remain available to support Treverbyn Parish Council on issues affecting local residents.
