

# Annual Report of Cornwall Councillor

## Treverbryn Parish Council – Annual General Meeting

### Introduction

This report provides an overview of my work as Cornwall Councillor for Penwithick & Boscoppa during the 2025–26 municipal year, with particular reference to matters affecting Treverbryn Parish and its residents.

Throughout the year, I have continued to engage with parish matters through resident casework, site visits, formal correspondence, attendance at council committees, and liaison with Cornwall Council officers, utility providers, partner organisations, and community groups.

### Community Engagement, Estate Management and Public Rights of Way

A substantial area of my work during the year has focused on Hallane Road and Trenarren View, where residents have raised long-standing concerns relating to overgrown public rights of way, footpaths, excessive weed growth, and general estate maintenance.

I undertook site visits in these areas and worked directly with Cornwall Council officers and contractors to raise concerns regarding obstructed paths, excessive weed growth, and the impact of poor routine maintenance on safety and accessibility. These matters required ongoing follow-up to ensure concerns were properly logged, evidenced, and progressed with the appropriate services.

### Infrastructure, Drainage and South West Water Issues

I have supported residents experiencing water, drainage and sewerage-related issues, including matters involving South West Water infrastructure. This has included assisting residents to raise issues with the correct organisation, supporting escalation where problems were persistent, and liaising with Cornwall Council officers where responsibilities overlapped.

## **Planning and Development**

I have reviewed weekly planning lists and engaged with applications affecting Treverbyn Parish, supporting residents and the Parish Planning Committee where appropriate, and participating in planning training and briefings to ensure informed and transparent decision-making.

## **Highways, Transport and Accessibility**

I have worked with officers on highways and transport issues including the A391 shared-use path, parking concerns, and accessibility considerations affecting residents and users of local infrastructure.

## **Funding, Community Projects and Partnerships**

I have supported Community Chest and other funding applications for local organisations and engaged with community groups and volunteers to support local initiatives and improve community facilities.

## **Council Committees, Training and Representation**

I have continued to carry out my Cornwall Council duties through committee membership, briefings, and training, supporting effective representation on behalf of residents.

## **Engagement with Treverbyn Parish Council**

I have maintained engagement with Treverbyn Parish Council primarily through written correspondence and liaison with the Parish Clerk, and I remain available to support parish matters through appropriate channels.

## **Forward Look**

I will continue to support residents, engage with planning, highways and infrastructure matters, and represent parish concerns through council processes and committee work.
